Where in Wales?

Wales may be a small country, but as Sam and Steph realise in the play, our accents are varied. In this short but fun activity, our actors try their best to use accents from across Wales. Can the pupils use an atlas to locate these places on a map?

Step 1: Start by re-watching [this section](#) of the play:



Step 2: Introduce the children to our map of Wales. First of all, discuss: *Which way is up? Which way is down? Do they know about the four points of the compass?*

Step 3: Once the map is in the right position, can the pupils locate their home town? This could be turned into a game – nearest guess wins a First Three Drops Superstar Sticker!

Step 4: Introduce an atlas by using one to check whose answer is correct.

Step 5: Listen to this [clip of Ioan](#) doing some terrible (*honestly they're great*) accents. They'll tell you where they're from, but can you find them on your map?

Each child can receive their own map on which they can place each town, or consider doing it as a group activity.
